SAFARIS & SEALIFE

Kruger A classic that doesn't disappoint. In this national park, clients can tick off Big-Five sightings. It's perfect for first-time safaris and honeymooners.

Stay: Dulini River Lodge – animal sightings are common at this waterway wonder.

Madikwe & Waterberg Two of South Africa's bestkept safari secrets. These malaria-free reserves are less crowded than some and ideal for families.


Stay: Sanctuary Makanyane – comprised of eight luxurious and secluded suites, overlooking a river.

Eastern Cape An area famed for restoring several endangered species to levels unseen for decades, home to high levels of game and two "Born Free" big-cat sanctuaries. A great extension for any Garden Route itinerary.

Stay: & Beyond Phinda Forest Lodge – an eco-luxe retreat set in the heart of a sand forest. It's perfect for honeymooners.

Hermanus A former fishing village, located on the Overberg Coast. Southern right whales migrate by here from June to December. This area offers wildlife sightings, long sandy beaches, mountainous terrain for hiking and boutique vineyards for wine tasting.

Stay: Birkenhead House – from this chic clifftop hotel, the views of Walker Bay or the towering distant Overberg Mountains are spectacular.

KwaZulu-Natal Known as the "Elephant Coast", this little-known wild and dramatic province is as low-key as they come. Think hiking, snorkelling, relaxing on golden beaches or even teeing-off. The Prince's Grant golf course has been named the best in South Africa.

Stay: Dulini River Lodge – enjoy intimate Big-Five viewing with suites offering panoramic views.

Kalahari Desert Despite the arid conditions, you'll find some of the best game-viewing in South Africa here. This is the place for travellers looking for a real sense of adventure, open spaces and true wilderness.

Stay: Tswalu Kalahari is a member of prestigious Relais & Chateaux. These two properties offer barefoot luxury in the wilderness.

Garden Route One of the most beautiful coastal roads in the worlds. Stop and check out the numerous wineries and restaurants along the way. Between June and November, you can spot whales en route.
